

Cameroon Trip Report

Special Species Accounts

March 13-April 6. 2003

Gorsachius leuconotus ***White-backed Night-Heron***

An adult flushed from the wooded shoreline of the crater lake below Ngoundaba Lodge, flying across the lake and behind the reed beds in late afternoon. An extralimital record for the Adamawa highlands.

Pteronetta hartlaubii **Hartlaub's Duck**

A distant pair loafing on the wooded riverbank, seen from the Senaga River Bridge between Yaounde and Douala. Two additional pairs seen well at a small pond near Douala. Near-threatened.

Chelictinia riocourii
Scissor-tailed [African Swallow-tailed] Kite

Single birds seen on several occasions, flying gracefully over open country and wooded savanna north of Mora and in Waza National Park.

Accipiter ovampensis **Ovampo Sparrowhawk**

A pair were found and seen well in the Benoue National Park and were strongly suspected to be breeding. This is a rarely recorded species in Africa

Peliperdix schlegelii **Schlegel's Francolin**

A pair found by Michael Mills near Ngoundaba in mid-morning was relocated and scope views were enjoyed by all. This is a rarely recorded species and the leader's first for more than ten years.

Agelastes niger **Black Guinea fowl**

A single bird was detected by its "pit—pit—pit" calls as we entered the Colobus trail from the Rengo Rock camp in mid-morning. It came onto the trail into full view of the group several times, coaxed by a recording.

Ortyxelos meiffrenii **Lark Buttonquail [Quail-plover]**

After a bit of effort, two were flushed by the Ornifolks skirmish line on separate occasions at a known site north of Mora. These offered good views in flight while being nearly impossible to spot on the deck.

Podica senegalensis **African Finfoot**

Two individuals, one of which was a juvenile, were seen by GMF just before disappearing into the shoreline vegetation at the edge of Awing Lake.

Ardeotis arabs **Arabian Bustard**

Scope views of three in mid-morning during our Waza National Park drive.

Pluvianus aegyptius **Egyptian Plover**

Long scope views of several on the river sandbanks below Campamante du Buffle Noir at Benoue National Park.

Glareola cinerea**Gray Pratincole**

Distant scope views of as many as 20 birds on sandbars of the Sanaga River between Yaounde and Douala. Identification made easier as occasional birds took wing.

Vanellus superciliosus**Brown-chested Lapwing**

A summer plumaged pair flushed furtively by our skirmish line near midday was seen by some, near the lodge at Ngoundaba Ranch. Probably the same pair was encountered in mid-morning the following day, when long scope views were enjoyed by all.

Rynchops flavirostris**African Skimmer**

Scope views of as many as 30 loafing on sandbars of the Senaga River between Yaounde and Douala. Near-threatened.

Columba sjostedti**Cameroon Olive-Pigeon**

Brief views of a trio flying quickly across Lake Awing and into an isolated montane forest patch were, sadly, the only sighting. Birds were breeding at this time and therefore relatively quiet and secretive. Near-threatened.

Streptopelia hypopyrrha**Adamawa Turtle-Dove**

Brief views as one came to drink from the Benoue River below Campament du Buffle Noir. Shortly afterward, one allowed scope views from a high exposed perch emerging from the gallery forest. Restricted range.

Tauraco bannermani**Bannerman's Turaco**

A single individual seen flying from one isolated native tree to the next, in open farm country of the Bamenda Highlands near the Bafut-Ngemba Forest Reserve, just as we arrived. Another individual seen well in an isolated patch of native vegetation the following day, when individuals were heard infrequently throughout the day.

Glaucidium sjostedti**Sjostedt's Owllet**

One responded to a recording and was eventually located near the Hunter's Trail in deep tall primary forest near Rengo Rock Camp. Lengthy scope views were possible from its perch about 6 meters above the deck. Probably the same individual was subsequently heard on several later occasions near the same area. Restricted range.

"Sjosted's Owllet" is the name used here, to avoid confusion with *G. castanonotum* of peninsular India.

Macrodipteryx longipennis **Standard-winged Nightjar**

Several superlative views of this remarkable creature were enjoyed, both on the deck and in flight, both in daylight and at night, at Ngoundaba Ranch, on its breeding territories.

Macrodipteryx vexillarius**Pennant-winged Nightjar**

Careful scope observations of a female on the deck in late morning along a ravine at Ngoundaba Ranch. Cameroon birds are non-breeding birds arriving in 'winter' quarters; consequently no vocalizations were noted during our night walks.

Apus batesi**Bates's Swift**

Distant fly-bys of several in mixed flocks of swifts from the veranda at the Lyas Hotel at Mundemba. Restricted range.

Ispidina lecontei**Dwarf Kingfisher**

One seen by several of us, perched about 2m above the deck on the Hunter's Trail, and another heard by SMA two days later.

Tockus albocristatus**White-crested Hornbill**

One of the top performers of the trip. Often heard in mid-story of tall lowland rain forest of Korup, a group of 4 was seen well (near a monkey troupe).

Lybius guifsobalito**Black-billed Barbet**

A bulbul-sized bird, with black body and red head and bib, which flew into the top of a large acacia near a water hole at Waza National Park could only be this species. If accepted, it would become the second record for Cameroon.

Indicator willcocksii**Willcocks's Honeyguide**

Late on the last evening of the trip, a pair were carefully scoped in the middle and upper canopy of a remnant montane forest patch. The lack of a distinct malar stripe on its grayish head and good views of the extent of white on the outer retrices drew us to this identification.

Sasia africana**African Piculet**

Sadly, only one bird was seen briefly by SMA on the lower slopes of Mount Kupe, which is possibly one of Africa's best sites for the species.

Campethera tullbergi**Tullberg's Woodpecker**

One seen well by all in an isolated patch of native habitat near the Bafut-Ngamba Forest Reserve, foraging in second growth, dense understory, often near the ground. Restricted range.

Smithornis sharpei**Gray-headed Broadbill**

Heard nearly every day from most sites at Mount Kupe and the Bakossi Mountains. A female was seen well in the middle story of montane forest on the Shrike Trail at about 950m elevation. Restricted range.

Hirundo preussi**Preuss's Swallow**

Reported from Ngoundaba Ranch, and subsequently seen well later at Campament du Buffle Noir. More than 15 seen at various stops on the drive from Yaounde to Douala.

Anthus camaroonensis**Cameroon Pipit**

Treated variously as races of *cinnamomeus* and *novaehollandiae*, representatives of this taxon were flushed into the gales of wind blowing across the ridgetop above Awing Lake, as our skirmish line swept the bracken slopes.

Coracina azurea**Blue Cuckooshrike**

Spotted by Kenedy, our forest guide, in the upper story of low canopy near a tree fall in tall primary lowland rain forest of Korup National Park.

Andropadus montanus**Cameroon Greenbul**

Single birds observed in understory and middle story along Max's Trail and in the Bakossi Mountains. More than ten seen well by all in remnant forest patches in the Bafut-Ngamba Forest Reserve. Restricted range.

Cossypha isabellae**Mountain Robin-Chat**

Two appeared before the group after being heard and prompted, from the middle story of remnant montane forest near the Bafut-Ngamba Forest Reserve. Restricted range.

Cossypha polioptera**Gray-winged Robin-Chat**

Heard in thick undergrowth of gallery forest at Ngoundaba Ranch in several locations, but proved to be very secretive and difficult to observe. Patchy distribution across West Africa.

Zoothera cameronensis**Black-eared Ground-Thrush**

Remarkable but typically brief views of this beautiful species were had by some on the main track into Korup NP. This shy species is rarely recorded by resident ornithologists, let alone birding groups, so to chance upon one feeding along the edge of the walkway was fortunate indeed.

Zoothera crossleyi **Crossley's Ground-Thrush**

Present in small numbers (5 or so) along the Shrike Trail at about 1050m elevation, but difficult to find because of its ventriloquial song echoing off the steep canyon walls. Seen well singing mid-level in the Bakossi mountains.

Bradypterus bangwaensis **Bangwa Forest-Warbler**

Close to the ground in dense understory and second growth in clearings and adjacent to native remnant montane forest patches in the Bafut-Ngamba Forest Reserve. Skulking and difficult to see as it crept along the ground towards the speaker before the group.

Prinia fluviatilis **River Prinia**

Separated from Tawny-flanked Prinia more readily by voice than by its more washed-out plumage features. In acacias near borrow pits and moist areas along the highway just south of Waza National Park. Recently (1983) described and reported for northern Cameroon.

Spiloptila clamans **Cricket Longtail**

A striking specimen was coaxed into performing for the group in the scrub of a wadi near the Lark Buttonquail site. This species is a relative newcomer to Cameroon probably due to the south moving Sahelian belt.

Drymocichla incana **Red-winged Gray Warbler**

JS found one in gallery forest at Ngoundaba Ranch, feeding near a group of White-faced Olivebacks.

Apalis bamendae **Bamenda Apalis**

In canopy and subcanopy of gallery forest edges at Ngoundaba Ranch. Performing well in response to recordings, it was our first Cameroon endemic of the trip.

Poliolais lopezi **White-tailed Warbler**

Coaxed briefly into view for some in dense understory of montane forest at about 1500m elevation on Max's Trail.

Hyliota flavigaster **Yellow-bellied Hyliota**

Seen well by all in middle story of plantation edge on lower Max's Trail at about 900m elevation.

Platysteira chalybea **Black-necked Wattle-eye**

This rather unobtrusive little forest gem with its lettuce green wattles is rarely recorded by all. Two birds were seen, one in a bird party at around 1500m on Max's Trail on Mount Kupe and another in the Bakossi mountains whilst we were all still celebrating Kupe Bush-shrike.

Platysteira laticincta **Banded Wattle-eye**

Despite hours of effort, this endangered denizen of BMFR was not definitively heard or seen. Endemic.

Batis poensis **Fernando Po [Bioko] Batis**

A pair in the coffee plantations near Nyososa in the lower canopy and middle story of a fruiting tree.

Picathartes oreas**Gray-necked Rockfowl**

This spectacular bird is often visiting birders most wanted species. Unique, bizarre and quite thrilling are words which well describe its favoured habitat let alone the bird. Others could be secretive, awkward or downright impossible. We visited a favoured site, sat uncomfortably for long periods, pestered by a multitude of flying beasties, and were honoured by a pair's presence for up to an hour on the second evening and briefly on the third. Despite being around, the species is always difficult to get to grips with. Stunning views were had by some, bouncing silhouettes by others, a quite remarkable bird in a wondrous place.

Ptyrticus turdinus**Thrush Babbler**

Several pairs heard in gallery forest at dawn on Ngoundaba Ranch. One pair was subsequently coaxed into performing well for the group. Restricted range.

Anthoscopus punctifrons**Sennar Penduline-Tit**

After searching, this Sahel specialty was eventually detected in the upper canopy of scattered acacias in moist soil areas near borrow pits adjacent to the highway south of Waza National Park.

Nectarinia ursulae**Ursula's Sunbird**

One was seen well in middle canopy of steep slopes along the Shrike Trail, with a bird party between 950-1000m elevation. Another was reported for Max's Trail, and a third was seen in the Bakossi Mountains, at higher elevations. Near-threatened, and endemic.

Malaconotus gladiator**Green-breasted Bushshrike**

Sadly no sightings this year, the first time in a long time. Beaten by heavy rain both times we were close to territories on both Mount Kupe and the Bakossi Mountains. The Kupe birds responded to whistles only to be lost in the sudden downpour, would not however trade for the next species. Vulnerable and endemic.

***Malaconotus [Telophorus] kupeensis*
Serle's [Mount Kupe] Bushshrike**

Concerted efforts along the Shrike Trail and Max's Trail went fruitless. But the local guide for the Bakossi Mountain site was acquainted with two resident pair and led us to them. We were able to observe all four at close range and in good light. Critically threatened and endemic.

Grafisia torquata**White-collared Starling**

Present in low densities at Ngoundaba Ranch where a few were seen on all four days.

Ploceus bannermani**Bannerman's Weaver**

Several seen at various points in fragmented montane forest remnants in the middle story. Vulnerable, restricted range.

Ploceus insignis**Brown-capped Weaver**

One seen at close range in middle canopy of remnant montane forest near Awing Lake of the Bafut-Ngamba Forest Reserve. Restricted range.

Ploceus albinucha**Maxwell's Black Weaver**

One seen at close range in middle canopy of primary forest from Korup suspension bridge.

Ploceus dorsomaculatus**Yellow-capped Weaver**

A single bird was seen well at forest edge in the Bakossi Mountains. Restricted range.

Ploceus preussi**Preuss's Weaver**

A family party was seen at very close quarters along Max's Trail at about 1100m elevation, as the trail climbs from plantations into the montane forest. Restricted range.

Malimbus racheliae**Rachel's Malimbe**

A luminous male was collecting nesting material near a treefall in the middle story of tall primary lowland rain forest along the Chimpanzee trail. Restricted range.

Nesocharis shelleyi**Fernando Po [Little] Oliveback**

The favoured site on Mount Kupe was sadly overgrown and the species proved very difficult to see despite many heard in the vicinity. Two birds were seen briefly. The species also proved very difficult in the Bamenda Highlands and birds were presumed to be in early breeding.

Euschistospiza dybowskii**Dybowski's Twinspot**

Long scope views of several smart-looking individuals resting in heavy shaded gallery forest about 1m off the deck at the forest edge. Apparently not associating with nearby parties of pytilias and firefinches.
